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INTRODUCTION

The Women's Association for Liberation, Transformation and Community Health (WATCH) continued its mission during 2022-23 with an unwavering commitment to uplift vulnerable communities and provide protection, education, health care, and livelihood opportunities. Our work is rooted in principles of dignity, equality, and social justice. Throughout the year, WATCH provided structured support to women, children, youth, and families living in economically and socially challenging circumstances.

The organisation worked intensively on school enrollment awareness. A total of 92 children were newly enrolled, and several dropout children were reintegrated.

Home for Children Living with HIV/AIDS

WATCH operates a full-time residential home for 40 HIV/AIDS-affected children. The programme ensured comprehensive support covering nutrition, accommodation, education, medical care, and emotional wellbeing. Daily meals, study support, medical check-ups, ART adherence monitoring, and access to quality education were ensured throughout the year.



EDUCATION, SCHOOL ENROLLMENT & CHILD DEVELOPMENT

The organisation worked intensively on school enrollment awareness. A total of 92 children were newly enrolled, and several dropout children were reintegrated. Regular motivation sessions were conducted for parents and adolescents to strengthen their commitment towards education.



HEALTH INITIATIVES & IMMUNISATION CAMPAIGN

WATCH conducted immunisation campaigns to ensure timely vaccination for children. More than 210 children received timely immunisation support. Mothers' awareness sessions on nutrition, hygiene and preventive care were also organised.



Sports, Recreation & Child Wellbeing

Sports and recreational activities were held throughout the year to ensure emotional and physical wellbeing of more than 300 children. Activities included sports competitions, indoor games, cultural events, and yoga sessions.



Strengthening Women's Self-Help Groups (SHGs)

WATCH strengthened 32 SHGs through training on bookkeeping, leadership, savings, and income-generation. Women reported increased financial independence, confidence, and improved decision-making abilities.



Mobilisation of Government Programmes

A total of 215 families were supported to access critical government schemes including pensions, ration cards, disability ID cards, scholarships, and CM Health Insurance Scheme.

Skill Development Initiatives

Two major livelihood programmes were implemented:

- Computer education for 75 youth covering MS Office, digital literacy, and online applications.
- Tailoring training for 45 young women, enabling them to start home-based enterprises.



Community Relief & Emergency Support

Dry ration kits, sanitary napkins, clothing, notebooks, and emergency supplies were distributed to vulnerable families throughout the year.

Overall Impact Summary 2024–25

- 40 children supported in HIV/AIDS home
- 92 children enrolled in school
- 210 children received immunisation support
- 300+ children participated in sports activities
- 32 SHGs strengthened
- 215 families accessed government schemes
- 75 youth trained in computer skills
- 45 women trained in tailoring
